Zongli Lin is a Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering at University of Virginia, Charlottesville, Virginia, USA. Professor Lin received his B.S. degree in mathematics and computer science from Xiamen University, Xiamen, China, in 1983, his Master of Engineering degree in automatic control from Chinese Academy of Space Technology, Beijing, China, in 1989, and his Ph.D. degree in electrical and computer engineering from Washington State University, Pullman, Washington, in 1994.

His current research interests include nonlinear control, robust control, time-delay systems, and control of magnetic suspension systems. In these areas, he has published four books and over 400 papers, over 180 of which are in archival journals.

He was an Associate Editor of *IEEE Transactions on Automatic Control* (2001-2003) and *IEEE/ASME Transactions on Mechatronics* (2006-2009) and has served on the operating committees and program committees of several conferences. He was an elected member of the Board of Governors of the IEEE Control Systems Society (2008-2010). He currently serves on the editorial boards of several journals and book series, including *Automatica*, *Systems & Control Letters*, *Science China: Information Science*, and *Science Press/Springer Book Series on Systems and Control*. He is a Fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineering (IEEE) and a Fellow of the International Federation of Automatic Control (IFAC).
